SOC Council	<p>System Webinars. Mary Ann Merz reported on the successful completion of the webinars. She thanked Mockia Shelton for leadership in creating the presentations along with the agency staff and family representatives who were part of the videos and webinar presentations.</p> <p>SOC Project Year 1 Report. Mary Ann summarized the performance indicators for outreach, referrals, and access to evidence-based services. Strengths include the collaboration among the Network of Practice, the excellent engagement skills of the Family Support Partners, and the Touchpoint meetings for referrals from DJOs. Challenges include the low number of referrals and engaging families in the Integrated Family Treatment.</p> <p>Vision and Goals. Al Eason shared his thoughts on the need for Integrated Family Treatment, including how it can become the gold standard in Missouri by addressing the unmet mental health needs of parents/caregivers along with the child’s needs. He also addressed the goal of building bridges between the juvenile justice system and behavioral health. He emphasized the importance of building caseloads to demonstrate the effectiveness of the model by recruiting</p>	

	<p>referrals at the early stage of justice involvement for prevention and early intervention.</p> <p>Parent Advisory Council (PAC). The SOC PAC held their first meeting in January, which produced an active discussion. They are continuing to recruit new members.</p> <p>Strategic Financing Plan. James Owen reported that we have received a proposal from Manatt Health consultants as well as an offer for consulting from the National Technical and Training Center for Systems of Care. We have met with several stakeholders individually to help focus this strategic planning process.
